BLACKPOLL WARBLER MIGRATION ROUTE

A Blackpoll Warbler fitted with a geocator in Vermont headed to the Atlantic Coast before beginning a long, non-stop flight over the Atlantic Ocean to Hispaniola. After a couple of days of rest, it then finished its journey south to Venezuela, where it spent the winter. The following spring, it flew back north along a more western route. After stopping for a little over a week in the Greater Antilles, it then continued through Florida and stuck close to the Atlantic Coast all the way back up to Vermont, where it was eventually recaptured.
